Call to Order and Introductions – Chair Williams called the meeting to order and welcomed all present at 1:05 PM. Introductions were made around the room, followed by those participating remotely, which included TCC members Caroline Kone, Phillip Lookadoo, and Greg Wilson. Upon a motion by Mr. Wright and a second by Mr. Marshall, the TCC unanimously approved the remote participation of the listed TCC members.

Action Items:

- I. Approval of Minutes Chair Williams asked members if they had a chance to review the minutes from the March 23, 2022, TCC meeting. Without objection, Chair Williams added Item I to the Consent Agenda.
- II. Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) Revision for Board of Transportation Mr. Horton presented the TIP revisions previously released for public comment and noted that no comments had been received. Without any member objections, Chair Williams added Item II to the Consent Agenda.

- III. Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) Revision for City of Hickory Mr. Horton noted this TIP revision supported the recently endorsed Congestion Mitigation Air Quality (CMAQ) application received from City of Hickory for C-5196 Sandy Ridge Road to add \$502,146 in supplemental CMAQ funding for right-of-way, plus add \$1,000,000 in supplemental CMAQ funding for construction. Without any member objections, Chair Williams added Item III to the Consent Agenda.
- **IV. Release of New TIP Revisions** Mr. Horton presented new TIP revisions that correspond to those also released by the Board of Transportation. Without any member objections, Chair Williams added Item IV to the Consent Agenda.
- V. Consent Agenda Chair Williams called for adoption of the Consent Agenda. Upon a motion by Mr. Greer and a second by Ms. Krige, the TCC unanimously adopted the Consent Agenda.
- VI. Update on Development of the 2024-2033 State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) Mr. Horton presented the early draft of the STIP that had just been released by NCDOT on April 25, 2022. Mr. Horton showed which of the previously identified "at-risk" or "reevaluation" projects now either had "advanced to delivery" (2 in Caldwell and 3 in Catawba), "remain development" (6 in Burke and 2 in Catawba), or "newly unfunded" (2 in Burke and 2 in Catawba). Mr. Horton asked NCDOT to clarify the cutoff for delivery as any activity programmed by 2028, which Mr. Wasserman confirmed. Mr. Horton also shared the possibility of swapping projects, if their combined costs did not exceed 110% of the replaced project(s). Mr. Stafford commented the swapped projects should ideally be in the same funding pot, though not ultimately required. As this was an information item, no action was needed.
- VII. Draft Changes to Comprehensive Transportation Plan (CTP) Mr. Horton presented how early proposed changes to the CTP, following engagement with area local governments. Mr. Horton summarized the draft changes as removing multiple future new alignments and median-divided widening projects, while re-classifying multiple existing corridors as Other Major Thoroughfare Needs Improvement to support future modernization projects. As this was an information item, no action was needed.

NCDOT Update -

- **Division 11** Mr. Sizemore noted the rehab of 321 southbound bridge recently started.
- **Division 12 –** Mr. Panicker shared his printed report.
- **Division 13** Ms. Hannah Cook noted Exit 112 was still on track to be completed this summer.
- NCDOT-TPD Ms. Pam Cook shared her update via the TPD Newsletter.
